There were 12,000 family teams this year! The 10th family team raised around \$27,000 and the number one family team raised over \$100,000! We raised close to \$38,000. and placed fifth. Last year, we won 2nd Place Top Family Team out of 9000 with \$34,000. It is not easy to be in the Top Family Teams. That is why it is important to work together each year. Individual Family Teams and people who walk in other locations can still be part of SA's team.

When they presented us the award, our name, a brief description, and pictures of our MODS TENT, Memory Corner and team were shown on two huge screens in front of 500 people. We had our picture made with Jennifer Howse, the president of March of Dimes after she handed us our award. Just like last year, people congratulated us all weekend...

As a result of being so visible, people asked about SA. We handed our Walk America mini-newsletters and SHARE Atlanta brochures to interested staff and volunteers.

They have changed the WalkAmerica name to "March for Babies" to include many different issues and to speak to the specific types of efforts that they are working towards. So, the new name is perfect!
