Why SHARE Atlanta supports March of Dime's WalkAmerica...

For 21 years, SA has provided emotional and medical support for our families. We looked for another organization that extended these efforts. We have found that in the March of Dimes. Let me share, why I think the March of Dimes is where we need to place our confidence.

March of Dimes: Driven, Professional, Kind. Supports Volunteers

In 1998, Jennifer first walked for the March of Dimes. At that time, SA, and most likely the March of Dimes, didn't realize the full potential of their outreach. While I knew the walk was important, I didn't really know all the goals of the MODs. During the past 4 years, I have read their materials and attended several of their luncheons. Then last year, because of our 2nd place National Family Team Award, we spent 2 days at the March of Dime's Conference. In all of these, the professionalism, focus, and drive of the MODs people impressed me greatly. Just as we do, they believe in the volunteer. The kindness that flowed throughout each event is incredible. I was being pulled toward the March of Dime's people!

March of Dimes: Focusing on ending prematurity and difficult pregnancies

At the conference, I learned the incredible details of the programs being developed to help families who have experienced a premature birth and to help stop prematurity. Their intervention and prevention information focuses on healthy as well as difficult pregnancies. The workshops made me realize their potential for providing answers for stillbirth and miscarriage issues. I kept thinking how their <u>programs</u> might help our members.

March of Dimes: Facing the fact that some babies do die. There is a need for support.

The real eye opener for me was when they started to talk about the babies that have died. I have spent years talking to doctors and speaking at conferences, and most doctors do NOT want to broach that particular subject. MODs does. They handle the death of a baby with much love and understanding.

At the 2007 Kickoff Chairmen Club's luncheon, one video highlighted the story of twins: one lived with the help of MODs support; one died at birth. They showed the couple at the cemetery remembering their baby that died. Her twin is now a healthy, active 5 year old. 2005's ambassador mom, talked about her 5 babies that didn't make it. Then, she introduced her living son, Justin. I couldn't believe it! 





- Helping to find the cause and prevention of birth defects (ie. long term & new drive for the use of folic acid BEFORE pregnancy to prevent neural tube issues such as spinal bifida and anencephaly)
- Helping to find the cause and prevention of preterm births (some cause stillborn babies) ...could lead to prevention of too early births due to "miscarriage"- (ie. progesterone use/studies,)
