

Grief after a Pregnancy or Newborn Loss - SHARE Atlanta's Outreach... "Permission to Grieve"

- Grief begins at the beginning. It begins as soon as we know the baby will die or has died.
- By presenting grief *material* and encouraging grief *activity* (acknowledging and, when possible, "parenting" their baby) we give parents "permission to grieve."

Generally, society, which includes the parents and most of those around them, dismisses pregnancy and newborn loss and encourages moving-on. This reduces the significance of the loss in the eyes of the parents thus lessening their ability to openly grieve. They feel pain, but deny it because everyone else does. This fact tied to the impact of initial shock, may cause the parents to respond in a manner that is not consistent with what is thought as "normal" grief reactions. They may not cry or express sadness. But, grief has begun.

Embracing Parenthood

The process of grief and healing can begin when the caregiver embraces their *parenthood* with mementos and affirmation toward their baby. *SHARE Atlanta's materials given with our 4 Bs' baby blankets and buntings*, further validate that their baby is special. Our Survival Kit reassures them that their feelings of grief are normal after their baby dies. Our packets demonstrate that a baby's death is significant. A group was formed by parents who have experienced this type of loss. It makes the parents immediately aware that they are *not alone* in their pain, confusion, and subsequent grief.

By sharing our materials, the caregiver gives the *option* and the *responsibility* of seeking grief support to the parents. Then, the opportunity for support is available to the parents at any point along their grief journey. Even if they choose to initially discard the materials, they know there is a group to connect to. If no material is given, this particular path of grieving may be closed to them. Statements from parents such as: "...after *many* telephone calls I was *finally* given your group's name and number." should not happen.

Together, SHARE Atlanta *and* **caregivers** can provide hope through ongoing support that starts *at the beginning* of the parent's journey. Opening doors is a positive healing mechanism –one that we can mutually provide. Marcia McGinnis, President of SHARE Atlanta


